- Agenda Approval
 - Agenda approved Unanimous
- Upcoming town meeting / budget review
 - o BOF meeting will be on the 13th; TBD if Fiber will be approved line item
 - o Follow up meeting likely in May to vote on the final budget
 - Primary objective for the next 2-3 months is to drive approval of the budget (town awareness and sentiment)
 - Drive 100+ supporters to attend
 - Should we plan to call people prior to the meeting?
 - Kim to finalize a call list in early April
 - Information package to be prepared by mid April
 - Goal: Specific materials to help people understand the project
 - Details on budget / voting process
 - Total increase in town budget projected to be 8-9% (of which, Fiber plan represents 1-2%)
 - Fiber impact on town is planned to be recouped by private donations
 - Timing of final town vote could be delayed as Town waits for final details on state provided funding
 - Need to design a simple talk script for presenting the Fiber plan impact / private reimbursement at town meeting to ensure people understand the impact
 - May be a good idea to collect first year donations prior to the town meeting so we can represent that the donations are already available
- Town education / Marketing
 - Will need to prepare comparison chart on how to cobble together Comcast like experience through multiple providers

- What providers?
 - Fubo, Sling TV, Hulu
- What is learning curve?
- What is cost comparison?
- Recommendation to use multiple marketing sources to reach customers
 - Continue inserts
 - Direct mail piece?
- Marketing strategy meeting to be convened to discuss plan for coming weeks –
 Kim to send out invite for subcommittee
- Getting people to switch: Lower cost and faster speed; not just a low cost offering
- The four basic benefits
 - Divide into emotional and practical benefits
 - Emotional
 - Universal: Equity for the town; digital divide disappears
 - Reliability: The only fiber network in the town was available throughout the town black out last summer
 - Affordable
 - Future proof: Never need another service for your life
 - Civic pride? There is crumbling infrastructure in this country; this is opportunity to get together with your neighbors and make something better

- What does universality really mean?
 - Outside of connecting homes far from the road, we still need to finalize the plan for providing services to low-income homes
 - This will be tabled as it is not part of initial plan approval
