

Natural Resources Inventory (NRI) 2023  
Corrections and Editing  
April 24, 2024

A review of the first printing of the second edition of the Norfolk Natural Resource Inventory showed that there were several corrections needed. Many of these are simple typos or formatting errors. Some were unintentional omissions. Below we've listed misspellings and corrections of facts.

Several page references within the text are incorrect. These will be changed in an upcoming digital version.

P. 1 Under title & subtitle: Front cover: Pink ladyslipper (Cypripedium [not Cypripedium])

P. 29 First paragraph: change url for F&WS NWI to:

P. 57 Credits for photos listed as Xxxx Xxxx change to Christopher Little (cycling, canoeing) and Great Mountain Forest (hikers).

PP. 78 & 79 Page references are incorrect and several lists and tables are missing. P. 80 At the bottom of the Climate Chart, the labels for Avg. Monthly Rainfall (which should read Precipitation) and Avg. Monthly Temp. (which should read Temperature) are reversed (temperature is red, precipitation is blue).

P. 107 Native Shrubs: add:

<i>Taxus canadensis</i>	American yew
<i>Vaccinium angustifolium</i>	Lowbush or Late sweet blueberry
<i>Vaccinium corymbosum</i>	Highbush blueberry
<i>Vaccinium macrocarpon</i>	Large cranberry
<i>Vaccinium oxycoccus</i>	Small cranberry
<i>Viburnum acerifolium</i>	Maple-leaved viburnum
<i>Viburnum dentatum</i>	Southern arrowwood

P. 116 Wildflowers: *Typha latifolia*, the common name, Common or Broad-leaved cattail, should be in the Common Name column.

P. 126 Norfolk Mammals, under BATS: under Status, change r/n to \* for the first 4 and 6th bats (big brown, red, hoary, silver-haired, & little brown).

 Golden-winged warbler, remove \*\*, and add V to first scientific name, *Vermivora*
