Meeting was called to order at 6:01 p.m.

Review and approve minutes of last meeting: May minutes approved.

Budgeting for the replanting of Station Place was discussed, responsibility for planting and maintenance costs need to be resolved.

Funding for the Plant Exchange was discussed.

Motion: Susannah put forth a motion to postpone Station Place planting. Funds would be used to purchase native plants for the Plant Exchange. Motion Seconded by Shelley. The Motion was unanimously approved.

Review Procedural Guidelines: Susannah will distribute the guidelines via email for a final review before printing and distribution.

Norfolk Conservation Consortium: The group will be meeting June 17th, 1:30 at the HUB to discuss future programs and events.

NCC seed funding: Disturbed areas could be replanted with native seed purchased by the NCC. John advises not mixing conservation seed mix with contractor mix per Matt's suggestion. Selective mowing needs to be discussed.

Culvert report: Culverts maps are available in Matt's office and are available to the public.

Road Salt Testing: Nothing new.

Light pollution: Nothing new.

Beaver Control: Susannah met with John Egan from Beaver Solutions to discuss culvert protective fencing. This could save money by reducing clean up costs. Beaver Solutions will provide an estimate for installation.

Action Item: Becky will alert Troy to the culvert map availability.

Beech leaf disease: Susannah is monitoring her applying a chemical treatment to her own trees per recommendation of Dr. Robert Marra of the CT Experimental Station.

Replanting 10 Station Place: Costs for planting and maintenance needs to be resolved.

Action item: Susannah to pin down ownership of plot. Further discussion on maintenance at the next meeting when Nash can be present..

Friends of the City Meadow: Libby and George have started documenting the meadow to present progress and highlight areas of concern and the ownership of different sections, this will be posted on-line. Examples of successful wetland meadows will help the public understand the goal of the planting. A volunteer weeding program is in development.

Rails to Trails recommendations: Nothing new. Permitting is ongoing, construction bids will follow.

Action Item: John to continue following.

Mapping and removal of invasive plants: Becky has been working with the Northwest Conservation District to organize a meeting of 13 local town road crews. The goal is to educate crews about the problem and solution of invasive plants. Date for meeting later in the summer.
