

Understand the New SNAP Changes!

A new federal law called H.R.1, also known as the One Big Beautiful Bill Act, is changing rules about SNAP benefits. Find out if the new SNAP rules apply to you.

- 1** Your benefits may be changing if you are:
- Between the ages of 18–64
 - Living with a child over the age of 14
 - Currently pregnant, or physically or mentally unable to work
 - Caring for a person who is ill or disabled
 - Receiving disability benefits such as SSI, SSDI, or VA
 - Participating in a drug or alcohol treatment program

Now visit the CT Department of Social Services' (DSS) website and answer a few questions.



- 2** You may need to provide additional documentation to keep your SNAP benefits. Submit your verification documents (which could include proving pregnancy, household size, a medical condition, or proof that you are working/volunteering or attending an educational or training program).

This can be as simple as taking a photo with your phone and submitting it through MyDSS or ConneCT.
